SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 98

MEDICAID. Requests the Louisiana Department of Health to apply for a waiver from the United States Department of Heath and Human Services to allow Medicaid reimbursement for individuals, including juveniles in detention.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to apply for a waiver from the
3	United States Department of Health and Human Services to allow Medicaid
4	reimbursement for individuals, including juveniles in detention.
5	WHEREAS, Section 1115 of the federal Social Security Act gives the secretary of
6	United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) authority to approve
7	experimental, pilot, or demonstration projects that are found by the secretary to promote the
8	objectives of the Medicaid program; and
9	WHEREAS, fifteen states have submitted a partial waiver request to the Center for
10	Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to allow Medicaid reimbursement for incarcerated
11	individuals to improve healthcare transitions into the community; and
12	WHEREAS, Section 5032 of the Substance Use-Disorder Prevention that Promotes
13	Opioid Recovery and Treatment for Patients and Communities Act (SUPPORT Act) (Pub.
14	L. No. 115-271), Promoting State Innovations to Ease Transitions Integration to the
15	Community for Certain Individuals, directs the secretary of HHS to "work with states on
16	innovative strategies to help individuals who are inmates of public institutions and otherwise
17	eligible for medical assistance under the Medicaid program under title XIX of the Social
18	Security Act transition, with respect to enrollment for medical assistance under such

1	program, seamlessly to the community"; and
2	WHEREAS, the first state has received approval from CMS to partially waive the
3	statutory Medicaid inmate exclusion policy allowing Medicaid reimbursable services to be
4	provided to incarcerated individuals ninety days prior to release; and
5	WHEREAS, CMS released guidance to states on this specific issue on April 17,
6	2023; and
7	WHEREAS, Louisiana has the highest incarceration rate in the country and
8	justice-involved individuals are disproportionately low-income and often have complex and
9	chronic conditions; and
10	WHEREAS, the majority of individuals, including juveniles, that enter custody have
11	unmet health needs, including serious physical, mental, emotional, and behavioral needs; and
12	WHEREAS, providing pre-release services for individuals through Medicaid would
13	improve continuity of care, prevent disruptions in services, and save the lives of individuals
14	with unmet health needs by creating a post-release care plan that addresses addiction-related
15	recidivism and reduces overdose deaths; and
16	WHEREAS, one of the critical terms of the waiver is the opportunity for the
17	provision of behavioral health services, including mental health and substance use disorder
18	treatments; and
19	WHEREAS, this type of waiver would present an opportunity for Louisiana to
20	address health disparities, reduce long-term health care costs, and improve the overall health
21	of incarcerated individuals, including juveniles in the state.
22	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
23	does hereby urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to apply for a waiver from
24	the United States Department of Health and Human Services to allow Medicaid
25	reimbursement for individuals in detention, including juveniles.
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does
27	hereby urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to study the feasibility and
28	associated costs of requesting a waiver from CMS to allow Medicaid reimbursement for
29	individuals in detention, including juveniles.
30	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does

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1	hereby urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to make a written report of the
2	status, including the results of feasibility and cost analyses conducted, of the waiver request
3	under Section 1115 of the Social Security Act to the Louisiana Legislature no later than
4	January 1, 2024.
5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
6	secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health.
