STUDENTS: Provides relative to administration of public schools

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:264(A)(1), 351.1(B)(3)(d)(i), and 381 and to enact R.S.
3	17:264(C) and 1942.1, relative to the administration of public schools; to provide
4	relative to donations to schools; to require the State Board of Elementary and
5	Secondary Education to submit an annual report to the legislature relative to local
6	compliance with special education requirements and to post the report on its website;
7	to provide relative to the diploma endorsement program for the performance of
8	community service by high school students; to provide relative to textbooks and
9	other instructional materials; and to provide for related matters.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 17:264(A)(1), 351.1(B)(3)(d)(i), and 381 are hereby amended and
12	reenacted and R.S. 17:264(C) and 1942.1 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
13	§264. Community service; high school diploma endorsement program
14	A.(1) The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education may
15	establish a "Distinction for Community Service" diploma endorsement program to
16	recognize high school students who perform a certain number of hours of
17	documented community service. Community service hours shall not count toward
18	academic course work or graded work in any public school. The number of service
19	hours required to earn a diploma endorsement shall be determined by the state board

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1	and shall accrue from the ninth grade through the twelfth grade.

3	C. The community service performed pursuant to this Section shall not be
4	related to political activities of any kind.

19	§381. Acceptance of donations by state and parish school boards
20	The state board of education State Board of Elementary and Secondary
21	Education and the several parish school boards may, any school board, in accordance
22	with the provisions of this Part, <u>may</u> accept and administer any donation that may be
23	made to them for educational or literary purposes, and each board shall enumerate
24	details of the contents of such donations in a document made publicly available on
25	its website.

27	§1942.1. Compliance; report by state board
28	A. Not later than July first annually, the State Board of Elementary and
29	Secondary Education shall submit a written report to House Committee on Education

1	and the Senate Committee on Education relative to school district compliance with
2	special education requirements, which shall include, at minimum, the following:
3	(1) A description of the state board's audit process on compliance.
4	(2) School district compliance.
5	(3) School district noncompliance.
6	(4) How long the noncompliance issues have existed.
7	(5) School-level remediation action plans on noncompliance.
8	(6) Authority of the state board to remediate unresolved noncompliance.
9	(7) Actual actions taken by the state board to remediate unresolved
10	noncompliance.
11	B. The state board shall also post the report on its website in an easily

**Abstract:** Provides relative to public school administration.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:264) authorizes the State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) to establish a "Distinction for Community Service" diploma endorsement program for high school students who perform community service. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but prohibits the following:

- (1) Students from receiving academic credit for community service.
- (2) Political activity from qualifying as community service for purposes of present law.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:351.1) provides relative to public review of textbooks. Requires that student editions of textbooks be made available online. <u>Proposed law</u> requires all editions of textbooks be made available online and in-person.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:381) authorizes BESE and school boards to accept donations for educational and literary purposes. <u>Proposed law</u> requires such boards to make details of such donations available on their websites.

<u>Proposed law</u> (R.S. 17:1942.1) requires BESE to submit an annual report to the legislative committees on education relative to school district compliance with special education requirements.

(Amends R.S. 17:264(A)(1), 351.1(B)(3)(d)(i), and 381; Adds R.S. 17:264(C) and 1942.1)

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#### Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Education</u> to the original bill:

- 1. Remove the <u>proposed law</u> removal of requirement that BESE prescribe suitable teaching materials for instruction in free enterprise, an elective course for public high school students.
- 2. Remove the <u>proposed law</u> removal of authorization for sex education instruction to be offered in public elementary schools.
- 3. Remove the <u>proposed law</u> removal of authorization for sex education instruction to be offered at times other than the regular school day.
- 4. Remove the <u>proposed law</u> requirement that the legislative education committees review the implementation of the activities of the Quality Science and Mathematics Council.
- 5. Remove the <u>proposed law</u> abolition of the Advisory Council on Student Behavior and Discipline.
- 6. Remove the <u>proposed law</u> authorization for superintendents to waive instruction in adoption awareness, litter prevention and awareness, shaken baby syndrome, and parenthood education.

## The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Remove proposed law:
  - a. That required each public school governing authority to report to the state Dept. of Education (DOE) relative to the implementation of <u>present law</u> requirement that cursive writing be taught in all public schools and that DOE submit a cumulative report to the legislature.
  - b. That removed <u>present law</u> requirement that BESE prescribe suitable teaching materials for Civics and Free Enterprise instruction required by <u>present law</u> in all public high schools.
  - c. That required a school board that accepts federal funds for programs offering sex education pursuant to <u>present law</u> to approve the funds annually in a public meeting at a time and place advertised by the school board at least two weeks prior to the meeting.
- 2. Add <u>proposed law</u> requirement that BESE report on school districts' compliance with special education requirements.
