EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed legislation may lead to a marginal increase in local fund expenditures. Proposed law amends current law to require a version of all textbooks and instructional materials under review be made available online, and in-person for parent and general public review. Local education agencies (LEAs) may experience increased costs in the form of time and support for school system staff to organize in-person availability of materials for review.

Proposed law additionally requires all state and parish school boards to report any donations accepted and administered for educational or literary purposes. This report must be made publicly available on the school board's website. LEAs may experience a negligible increase in costs in the form of time and support to compile and publish this data.

Proposed legislation also requires the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to submit an annual report to the legislature relative to local compliance with special education requirements and to post the report on its website. BESE and LDE report they anticipate no impacts to expenditures as a result of this requirement.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
