<u>Proposed law</u> creates the crime of "unlawful deepfakes involving minors", which is the creation or possession of any material that depicts a minor engaging in sexual conduct using deepfake technology, and will be penalized by imprisonment at hard labor for not less than five and not more than 20 years, a fine of not more than \$10,000, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that "unlawful deepfakes involving minors" is the advertisement, distribution, exhibit, exchange, promotion, or sale of any sexually explicit material depicting a minor using deepfake technology and will be penalized by imprisonment at hard labor for not less than 10 and not more than 50 years, a fine of \$50,000, or both.

Proposed law defines "deepfake", "distribute", "minor", and "sexual conduct".

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for severability in the event one or more provisions of <u>proposed law</u> are found to be unconstitutional.

Effective August 1, 2023.
