CONDOLENCES: Expresses condolences on the death of Theodore "Ted" Alexander Castillo

A RESOLUTION

2	To express the condolences of the House of Representatives upon the death of Theodore
3	"Ted" Alexander Castillo.
4	WHEREAS, it is with immense sadness and profound regret that the House of
5	Representatives has learned of the death, on April 22, 2023, of Theodore "Ted" Alexander
6	Castillo; and
7	WHEREAS, Ted was born on November 11, 1924, and was a native of Leesville,
8	Louisiana; he graduated as valedictorian from Leesville High School in 1941 at the age of
9	sixteen; he played drums for the school band, and during his senior year, he served as a class
10	officer and sports editor of the school yearbook, the "Wampus Cat"; and
11	WHEREAS, Ted then enrolled at Louisiana State University to study journalism and
12	joined the Sigma Chi Fraternity; in 1943, he was drafted to serve as a morse code signalman
13	second-class in the United States Navy during World War II; during this time, he served in
14	Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and the Pacific, and he received the World War II Victory
15	Medal for his service; he was honorably discharged in March 1946; and
16	WHEREAS, Mr. Castillo returned to LSU to complete his education and discovered
17	a passion for sports journalism; after graduating, he embarked on what would become a
18	storied career in sports journalism covering high school sports for more than six decades;
19	he worked for The Morning Advocate from 1948 until 1991, and he continued part-time
20	coverage until 2002; he then took a position with the Louisiana High School Athletic
21	Association (LHSAA) where he worked until 2012; and

1 WHEREAS, Mr. Castillo was an incredibly respected figure in the sports journalism 2 field; he was a Heisman voter, a member of the LHSAA Hall of Fame, and he received a 3 Distinguished Service Award from the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame; he also received a 4 number of other writing awards including the Louisiana Sports Writers Award for 5 Excellence for his 1975 article about his son, David Castillo; he also covered the Dallas 6 Cowboys' first Super Bowl appearance, the World Series, and the National Invitational 7 Tournament during Pistol Pete's LSU career; and 8 WHEREAS, Ted was a press box regular at LSU sporting events from 1946 until 9 2019, and he was able to witness an incredible number of legendary LSU figures' careers 10 including Y.A. Tittle, Alvin Dark, Bob Pettit, Billy Cannon, Tommy Casanova, Shaquille 11 O'Neal, and Joe Burrow; he continued to attend press conferences and ask witty questions 12 well into his nineties; and 13 WHEREAS, Ted leaves to cherish his memory his wife of sixty-seven years, Marie 14 Louise "Bunny" Castillo; his beloved daughter, Marie-Louise "M'Lou" Castillo Arcuri; 15 granddaughters, Ali Castillo Landry and Marie-Louise Arcuri; grandsons, Grant Castillo and 16 Andrew Arcuri; and great-granddaughters, Eloise Marie Landry, Ava Grace Landry, and 17 Marie Louise Castillo; he will be deeply missed, but the legacy of his storied career in sports 18 journalism will live on forever in Louisiana sports history. 19 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the 20 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby express heartfelt condolences on the death of Theodore 21 "Ted" Alexander Castillo and does hereby extend sincerest wishes that his family, friends, 22 and loved ones find comfort in their shared memories of his beautiful life.
