Provides for the detention of seventeen year old juveniles under certain circumstances. (gov sig)

Current law defines child as (1) any person under the age of 21 who commits a delinquent act before attaining 17 years of age, (2) beginning March 1, 2019, any person under the age of 21, who commits a delinquent act on or after March 1, 2019, when the act is not a crime of violence and before attaining 18 years of age, and (3) after June 30, 2020, any person under the age of 21, who commits a delinquent act on or after July 1, 2020, and before attaining 18 years of age. Proposed law amends current law to define child as (1) before March 1, 2019, any person under 21 years of age who commits a delinquent act before attaining 17 years of age; (2) from March 1, 2019, and through June 30, 2020, any person under the age of 21 who commits a delinquent act that is not a crime of violence (COV) either before March 1, 2019, or through June 30, 2020, before attaining 18 years of age; (3) from July 1, 2020, through July 31, 2023, any person under the age of 21 who commits a delinquent act on or after July 1, 2020, through July 31, 2020, and before attaining 18 years of age; (4) beginning August 1, 2023, any person under 21 years of age who commits a delinquent act on or after August 1, 2023, when the act is not a COV and the act occurs before the person attains 18 years of age. Proposed law adds a provision indicating that "child" includes any person alleged to have committed any delinquent act prior to his 17th birthday.
