### **38 20-950 JUDGMENTS**

Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 49:112, the sum of \$18,500,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the State General Fund (Direct) for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 to be allocated to pay consent judgments and other final judgments against the state, Board of Tax Appeals judgments and recommendations for payment of a claim against the state, and reimbursements of attorney fees, all as provided in this Section. A judgment or recommendation may only be paid from this appropriation if it is final. All judgments and recommendations provided for in this Section shall be paid

1 as to principal, interest, court costs, and expert witness fees as awarded in each judgment or 2 recommendation, it being the intent herein that when the provisions of a judgment or 3 recommendation conflict with the provisions of this Act, the provisions of the judgment or 4 recommendation shall be controlling. Any other provision of this Act not in conflict with 5 the provisions of a judgment or recommendation shall control. Payment shall be made as 6 to each judgement, Board of Tax Appeals judgment or recommendation, or reimbursement 7 for attorney fees only after presentation to the state treasurer of documentation required by 8 the state treasurer. Further, all judgments and recommendations provided for in this Section 9 shall be deemed to have been paid on the effective date of the Act, and interest shall cease 10 to run as of that date.
