## **ACT 278 (HB 477)**

## 2023 Regular Session

Bacala

<u>New law</u> requires the prosecuting agency, when authorized to provide information, to include the following information in the indictment, information, or affidavit, if such information is provided by the booking agency:

- (1) Date of the offense.
- (2) Date of arrest or summons, if a summons was issued in lieu of an arrest.
- (3) The state identification number of the defendant, if one has been assigned to the defendant for the offense or for any prior offenses.
- (4) Defendant demographic data to include sex, race, and date of birth, if known.

<u>New law</u> provides that the above <u>new law</u> information may be provided in a separate document submitted with the bill of information, bill of indictment, or summons to the clerk of court.

<u>New law</u> further requires the booking agency to provide the information provided in <u>new law</u> to the prosecuting agency.

<u>New law</u> requires the clerk of court to report the information provided in <u>new law</u>, along with the disposition and disposition date, to the supreme court.

<u>New law</u> authorizes the supreme court to report the information provided in <u>new law</u>, along with the disposition and disposition date, to the La. Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information.

New law provides that failure to comply shall not constitute grounds for a motion to quash.
