Existing law (La. Highway Regulatory Act) provides, among other things, that the license plate assigned to a trailer, semitrailer, motorcycle, or other motor vehicle must be attached to the rear of the vehicle at all times.

New law retains existing law.

<u>Existing law</u> provides that the first violation of <u>existing law</u> (La. Highway Regulatory Act) or any regulation made pursuant to <u>existing law</u> will be punished by a fine up to \$175 or imprisonment up to 30 days, or both. <u>Existing law</u> further provides that a subsequent violation will be punished by a fine up to \$500 or imprisonment up to 90 days, or both.

<u>New law</u> provides that if the violation of <u>existing law</u> requiring the license plate be attached to the vehicle is committed in preparation to commit or during the commission of a felony in order to escape detection, the violator is to be punished by an additional fine of \$200, or an additional imprisonment of 30 days, or both. <u>New law</u> further permits law enforcement to impound the vehicle at the time of the violation of <u>existing law</u>.

<u>New law</u> otherwise retains <u>existing law</u>.
