TAX/LOCAL: Authorizes parishes to levy a tax on carbon dioxide injected for geologic sequestration

1	AN ACT
2	To enact Subpart G of Part I of Chapter 6 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of
3	1950, to be comprised of R.S. 33:2740.101, relative to parish revenue; to authorize
4	parishes to levy a tax on carbon dioxide injected for geologic sequestration; to
5	provide relative to rates, collection, and penalties; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. Subpart G of Part I of Chapter 6 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised
8	Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 33:2740.101, is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	SUBPART G. TAX ON SEQUESTERED CARBON DIOXIDE
10	§2740.101. Tax on sequestered carbon dioxide
11	A. A parish governing authority may levy and collect a tax on carbon
12	dioxide that is injected for geologic sequestration by a Class VI injection well that
13	is located within the parish.
14	B. The tax shall be levied by ordinance, which shall specify the tax rate,
15	collection procedures, and other administrative details, including required reporting
16	on injection rates and storage capacity, as deemed appropriate by the parish
17	governing authority. The ordinance may also provide penalties for delinquent
18	payments.

1 C. The owner or operator of the Class VI injection well who holds the permit 2 from the office of conservation to inject carbon dioxide for geologic sequestration 3 is liable for payment of the tax.

DIGEST

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Abstract: Authorizes a parish governing authority to levy a tax on carbon dioxide injected for geologic sequestration within the parish.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes a parish governing authority to levy a tax on carbon dioxide that is injected for geologic sequestration by an injection well that is located within the parish. Requires that the tax be levied by ordinance, which shall specify the tax rate, collection procedures, and other administrative details. Authorizes penalties for delinquent payments.

<u>Present law</u> requires that an entity wishing to inject carbon dioxide for geologic sequestration obtain a permit from the office of conservation.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the entity that holds such a permit is liable for payment of the tax authorized by <u>proposed law</u>.
