CONTRACTS: Provides for consent of a legal representative of a minor who contracts with certain parties

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 9:2717.2, and to repeal Sections 2 and 3 of Act No. 440 of the 3 2023 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana, relative to contracts with 4 minors; to provide relative to interactive computer services; to provide for public 5 policy; to provide for consent by a legal representative; to provide for exceptions; to 6 provide for nullity; to provide for definitions; to provide for an effective date; and 7 to provide for related matters. 8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 9 Section 1. R.S. 9:2717.2 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 10 §2717.2. Legal representative consent in contracts between a minor and an 11 interactive computer service 12 A.(1) It is declared to be the public policy of this state that minors are to be 13 protected in the online environment and that interactive computer services shall be discouraged from contracting with minors without the consent of a legal 14 representative. 15 16 (2) No interactive computer service shall enter into a contract or other 17 agreement, including the creation of an online account, with a minor without 18 obtaining the consent of the legal representative of the minor. 19 (2) The interactive computer service may rely on the consent of the legal 20 representative of the minor to enter into a contract or agreement, including the

4	B. Any contract or agreement entered into between a minor and an
5	interactive computer service without the express consent of the legal representative
6	of the minor shall be a relative nullity. The confirmation of a contract that is
7	relatively null in accordance with this Section shall be express and in writing.
8	C. Nothing in this Section shall bar the use of third parties to obtain the
9	consent of the legal representative, including the consent of the legal representative
10	as to multiple minors and multiple interactive computer services.
11	D. This Section applies only to minors who are domiciled in this state as
12	provided by Civil Code Article 41.
13	E. Nothing in this Section shall supersede or modify the provisions relative
14	to contracts made pursuant to Chapter 2 of Title IV of Book III of the Civil Code
15	Article 1923.
16	F.E. For the purposes of this Section:
17	(1) "Account" means any website, application, or similar electronic means
18	by which users are able to create and share information, ideas, personal messages,
19	and other content, including texts, photos, and videos, or to participate in social
20	networking, gaming, or a similar online service.
21	(2) "Consent" means having the written authority of a legal representative
22	of a minor to permit the minor to enter into a contract or other agreement with the
23	interactive computer service.
24	(3) "Interactive computer service" means any information service, system,
25	or access software provider that provides or enables computer access by multiple
26	users to a computer server, including a service or system that provides access to the
27	internet and such systems operated or services offered by libraries or educational
28	institutions.
29	(4) "Legal representative" means any of the following:

1 (a) A parent with legal authority over a minor. (b) The tutor of the minor as confirmed or appointed by the court. 2 3 (5) "Minor" means any person under the age of eighteen who is not 4 emancipated. 5 Section 2. Sections 2 and 3 of Act No. 440 of the 2023 Regular Session of the 6 Legislature of Louisiana are hereby repealed in their entirety. 7 Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 8 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 9 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 10 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become

Abstract: Provides for express consent of a legal representative of a minor who contracts with interactive computer services.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that it is the public policy of the state that minors are to be protected in the online environment and that interactive computer services shall be discouraged from contracting with minors without the consent of a legal representative.

<u>Present law</u> which becomes effective August 1st, 2024, provides that the interactive computer services may rely on the consent of the legal representative of the minor to enter into a contract or agreement, including the creation of an online account, with a minor unless the interactive computer service knows or reasonably should have known that the legal representative is no longer authorized to represent the minor.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides that any contract or agreement entered into between a minor and an interactive computer service without the consent of the legal representative of the minor shall be a relative nullity.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands <u>present law</u> to provide that the confirmation of a contract that is relatively null shall be express and in writing.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that the consent from the legal representative to contract with interactive computer services shall be express and in writing.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes references to the term "agreement".

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<u>Present law</u> provides that <u>present law</u> applies only to minors who are domiciled in this state as provided by Civil Code Article 41.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides that <u>present law</u> shall supersede or modify the provisions relative to contracts made pursuant to C.C.Art. 1923.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands <u>present law</u> to all provisions relative to contractual capacity as provided in <u>present law</u> (Chapter 2 of Title IV of Book III of the Civil Code).

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
