Present law provides relative to the crime of theft and provides penalties.

<u>Present law</u> provides that when there has been a misappropriation or taking by a number of distinct acts of the offender, the aggregate of the amount of the misappropriations or taking determines the grade of the offense.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that multiple distinct acts of the offender may be aggregated to determine the grade of the offense in cases where there is more than one victim.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the intent to permanently deprive the owner of property may be inferred where the property allegedly misappropriated or taken was removed from a porch or other unenclosed portion of a residence or inhabited dwelling and was delivered by the U.S. Postal Service or other commercial package, freight, or merchant delivery service.

<u>Proposed law</u> creates an additional penalty for offenders who misappropriate or take items from a porch or other unenclosed portion of a residence or inhabited dwelling that were delivered by the U.S. Postal Service or other commercial package, freight, or merchant delivery service.
