HOUSE COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

2024 Regular Session

Substitute for Original House Bill No. 401 by Representative Zeringue as proposed by the House Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works

This document reflects the content of a substitute bill but is not in a bill form; page numbers in this document DO NOT correspond to page numbers in the substitute bill itself.

To enact R.S. 2:604.3, relative to the Houma-Terrebonne Airport Commission; to authorize

the Houma-Terrebonne airport commission to appoint and commission peace

officers to enforce laws, rules, and regulations to secure the protection of persons,

properties, or interests relating to the commission within the jurisdictional

boundaries of the Houma-Terrebonne airport; and to provide for related matters.

Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published

as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of

Louisiana.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 2:604.3 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§604.3. Houma-Terrebonne airport commission; peace officers; appointment, duties,

and powers

<u>A.</u> The Houma-Terrebonne airport commission may, in its discretion, appoint and commission peace officers who shall enforce laws, rules, and regulations to secure the protection of persons, properties, or interests relating to the commission, and only within the commission's jurisdiction. Such jurisdiction shall consist of the physical boundaries of the Houma-Terrebonne airport as defined within the Code of Ordinances of the parish of Terrebonne and any immovable properties owned by the commission.

B. Peace officers so commissioned and appointed by the commission shall be employees of the commission and meet the following requirements:

(1) Be citizens of the state of Louisiana.

(2) Have attained the age of twenty-one.

(3) Be P.O.S.T. certified in accordance with the Peace Officers Standard and Training law.

<u>C.</u> Under the direction and control of the commission, the commission's peace officers shall exercise regular police powers of the state granted to law enforcement officers with respect to criminal and other offenses affecting the protection of persons, properties, or interests, but only as it relates to the commission, the airport, or to the performance of their duties for the commission, and only within the commission's jurisdiction.

D. Nothing in this Section shall prevent municipal, parish, or state law enforcement agencies with jurisdiction in Terrebonne Parish from maintaining and exercising their police powers within the commission's jurisdiction. In the event of a serious incident or contested scene, final authority shall be deferred to the police chief or his proxy.

<u>E. Except for exigent circumstances, the commission's peace officers shall</u> report and refer to a municipal, parish, or state law enforcement agency any suspected criminal activity within the commission's jurisdiction which may result in felony charges. A municipal, parish, or state law enforcement agency having concurrent jurisdiction with the commission, may, at its discretion, take the lead in or take over any investigation originating with the commission. The commission peace officers shall cooperate with such agency.

<u>F. Any persons arrested by the commission's peace officers, and the return</u> of all warrants or processes served by said officers, shall be surrendered or delivered to the appropriate law enforcement agency within the parish of Terrebonne.

<u>G.</u> The commission shall adopt rules and regulations for the conduct, management, training, and control of its peace officers, and may, from time to time, amend such rules and regulations in its discretion. The commission shall ensure its peace officers maintain proper and regular law enforcement training.

<u>H. Nothing in this Section shall be deemed, nor is it intended, to alter the</u> assessment, collection, and administration of ad valorem tax revenues within the commission's jurisdiction.

HB Draft 2024 Regular Session

Abstract: Authorizes the Houma-Terrebonne airport commission to appoint and commission peace officers and to authorize peace officers to make arrests and surrender those arrested to the appropriate law enforcement agencies.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides authority for the Houma-Terrebonne airport commission to appoint, fix salaries of, and pay its peace officers.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that the peace officers be employees of the commission and meet the following requirements: (1) be citizens of Louisiana, (2) be at least 21 years of age, and (3) be P.O.S.T. certified.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the peace officers to exercise regular police powers granted to law enforcement officers.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that such authority does not deprive any local law enforcement from performing their duties.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the peace officers to report to municipal, parish, or state law enforcement agencies any criminal activity that could result in felony charges and allows for the municipal, parish, or state law enforcement agencies to take over any investigations.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the return of all warrants or processes served by the peace officers to the appropriate law enforcement agency within Terrebonne Parish.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows for the commission to make rules and regulations relative to its peace officers and provides for modification to the rules and regulations.

<u>Proposed law</u> prevents the alteration of the assessment, collection, and administration of ad valorem tax revenues within the commission's jurisdiction.
