EVIDENCE: Provides relative to evidentiary presumptions in personal injury claims

1	AN ACT
2	To enact Civil Code Article 2315.12, relative to the presumption of causation of injuries; to
3	prohibit a presumption of causation in certain circumstances; to provide for
4	prospective application; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. Civil Code Article 2315.12 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	Art. 2315.12. Presumption of causation of injuries
8	The lack of a prior history of an illness, injury, or condition shall not create
9	a presumption that an illness, injury, or condition was caused by the act that is the
10	subject of the claim for personal injury.
11	Section 2. This provisions of this Act shall have prospective application only and
12	shall not apply to causes of action filed prior to the effective date of this Act.

**Abstract:** Eliminates the presumption of causation established by lack of prior history of an injury.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the lack of a prior history of an illness or injury shall not create a presumption that an illness or injury was caused by the act that is the subject of the claim.
