Amendments proposed by Representative Owen to Engrossed House Bill No. 716 by Representative Owen

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1, line 3, change "59" to "60"

3 AMENDMENT NO. 2

4 On page 1, line 12, change "59" to "60"

5 AMENDMENT NO. 3

6 On page 4, after line 29, insert the following:

7 "§60. Board exemptions

8 A. Nothing in this Chapter, except this Section, shall apply to occupations
9 licensed by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

10 B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Louisiana
11 State Board of Medical Examiners shall issue a license, certification, permit pending
12 normal license, or registration, as applicable, to any individual if, upon application
13 to the board, the applicant satisfies all of the following conditions:

14 (1) The applicant holds a current and valid occupational license in another
15 state in an occupation with a similar scope of practice, as determined by the board
16 in this state.

17 (2) The applicant has held the occupational license in the other state for at
18 least one year.

19 (3) The applicant has passed any examinations, or met any education,
20 training, or experience standards as required by the board in the other state.

21 (4) The applicant is held in good standing by the board in the other state.

22 (5) The applicant does not have a disqualifying criminal record as
23 determined by the board in this state pursuant to the laws of this state.

24 (6) The applicant has not had an occupational license revoked by a board in
25 another state because of negligence or intentional misconduct related to the
26 applicant's work in the occupation.

27 (7) The applicant did not surrender an occupational license because of
28 negligence or intentional misconduct related to the person's work in the occupation
29 in another state.

30 (8) The applicant does not have a complaint, allegation, or investigation
31 pending before a board in another state which relates to unprofessional conduct or
32 an alleged crime. If the applicant has a complaint, allegation, or investigation
33 pending, the board in this state shall not issue or deny an occupational license to the
34 applicant until the complaint, allegation, or investigation is resolved, or the applicant
35 otherwise satisfies the criteria for licensure in this state to the satisfaction of the
36 board in this state.

37 (9) The applicant pays all applicable fees in this state.

38 (10) The applicant simultaneously applies for a permanent license. If the
39 applicant fails to qualify for a permanent license as determined by the occupational
40 or licensing board once the permanent application is vetted, the permit automatically
41 terminates."
