INSURANCE: Repeals the termination provision of the Sledge Jeansonne Louisiana Insurance Fraud Prevention Act

1 AN ACT 2 To repeal R.S. 22:1931.13, relative to the Sledge Jeansonne Louisiana Insurance Fraud 3 Prevention Act; to repeal the termination provision of the Act; and to provide for an 4 effective date. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. R.S. 22:1931.13 is hereby repealed in its entirety. 7 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 8 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 9 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 10 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 11 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Repeals the termination date of the Sledge Jeansonne La. Insurance Fraud Prevention Act.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the Sledge Jeansonne La. Insurance Fraud Prevention Act. Generally authorizes the attorney general to pursue a civil action against anyone who commits fraud or any other illegal practice to obtain insurance payments.

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CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Present law</u> terminates the Sledge Jeansonne La. Insurance Fraud Prevention Act on July 1, 2024.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals the Act's termination provision and termination date. Otherwise retains <u>present law.</u>

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
