EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> will likely result in an indeterminable increase in SGF expenditures in the Department of Public Safety & Corrections - Corrections Services (DPS&C-CS) associated with services necessary to perform surgical vasectomy procedures and may result in an indeterminable increase in SGF expenditures in the Louisiana Department of Justice (Office of the Attorney General) associated with providing defense for any anticipated lawsuits challenging the law.

Department of Public Safety & Corrections-Corrections Services

<u>Proposed law</u> will likely result in an indeterminable increase in SGF expenditures in the DPS&C-CS, to the extent that the agency assumes the financial obligation for vasectomy procedures for those convicted of sex offenses. <u>Proposed law</u> requires that in addition to any other penalties provided by law, any person convicted of a sex offense as defined in La. R.S. 15:541 is mandated to be subject to a vasectomy. <u>Proposed law</u> would require DPS&C-CS to provide the services necessary to complete the surgical procedure by a licensed physician, if medically appropriate, and incur expenditures to the State of \$250-\$450 per offender. The exact fiscal impact to expenditures is unknown, because <u>proposed law</u> is prospective, and there is no way to determine the number of offenders who will be convicted of a sex offense and thereafter be subject to a vasectomy procedure in the future.

<u>Proposed law</u> would require the agency to provide the services necessary to complete the surgical procedure by a licensed physician, if medically appropriate. According to the Louisiana Medicaid Management system, the procedure would cost the State a total of \$250-\$450 per offender.

For informational purposes, DPS&C-CS reports that there are currently 5,161 offenders in State custody who have been convicted of a sex offense, and that for the past three years, there has been an annual average of 640 admissions for those convicted of sex offenses as defined in La. R.S. 15:541. If this trend were to continue, annual expenditures related to subjecting these offenders to a vasectomy procedure would begin to exceed \$100,000 with the admission of 222 to 400 offenders convicted of a sex offense each year.

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Department of Justice

The proposed legislation may result in an indeterminable increase in Statutory Dedication expenditures out of the Department of Justice Legal Support Fund in the Department of Justice (Attorney General) as a result of defending the State in anticipated lawsuits that challenge the proposed legislation. Assuming there is a constitutional challenge to the proposed law, the Attorney General anticipates that it will be required to provide a constitutional defense, which will involve incurring no less than \$150,000 in costs for outside counsel, expert witnesses, as well as costs related to general litigation. The exact fiscal impact to the Department of Justice is indeterminable, as there is no way to determine the number of constitutional challenges that may arise with proposed law's enactment, or the number or duration of appeals related to any anticipated litigation.
