Abstract: Prohibits financial institutions for denying or canceling services or discriminating against a person on the basis of certain factors.

Proposed law defines certain terms in accordance with their use in proposed law.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a financial institution to make determinations about the services provided based on an analysis of risk factors. <u>Proposed law</u> further provides that a financial institution may not engage in an unsafe and unsound practice as provided in <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that it is an unsafe and unsound practice for a financial institution to deny or cancel its services or to otherwise discriminate against a person on the basis of any of the following:

- (1) Political opinions, speech, or affiliations.
- (2) Religious beliefs, religious exercise, or religious affiliations.
- (3) Any factor if it is not a quantitative, impartial, and risk-based standard.
- (4) The use of any rating, scoring, analysis, tabulation, or action that considers a social credit score based on certain factors.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires financial institutions to annually attest to compliance of <u>proposed law</u> on a form prescribed by the office of financial institutions.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if a financial institution engages in a practice described in <u>proposed law</u> or fails to timely provide the attestation in accordance with <u>proposed law</u>, the financial institution shall be subject to applicable sanctions and penalties provided for <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if <u>proposed law</u> is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect any other provisions <u>proposed law</u>.
