CRIME/PUNISHMENT. Authorizes law enforcement to impound any vehicle used in a drag race, or other enumerated action or event, at the owner's expense, for thirty days to gather evidence pertaining to the crime. (8/1/24)

6	Section 1. R.S. 32:65(F) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§65. Drag racing and racing on public roads and certain property; exemptions
8	* * *
9	F. Any law enforcement agency authorized to enforce traffic regulations
10	in this state shall have the authority to impound, at the owner's expense, any
11	vehicle driven in a manner that violates this Section for up to thirty days to
12	gather evidence pertaining to the offense.

<u>Present law</u> makes it a crime to drive a vehicle in a race, speed competition or contest, drag race or acceleration contest, test of physical endurance, exhibition of speed or acceleration, or for the purpose of making a speed record on public roads or on any publicly or privately owned property to which public access is not prohibited.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows certain law enforcement agencies in this state to impound a vehicle, at the owners expense, for up to 30 days to gather evidence pertaining to the crime.

Effective August 1, 2024.
