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Provides that statewide elective offices and legislative offices are party primary offices

Proposed law redefines "party primary office" to include a state office voted on statewide, an office of senator or representative in the United States Congress, the office of justice of the supreme court, an elective office on a state board or commission, and the office of a member of the state House of Representatives or Senate.

Under current law, only the offices of senator or representative in the United States Congress, justices of the supreme court, the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, and the Public Service Commission are considered party primary offices.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. Proposed law redefines "party primary office" to include state office voted on statewide, an elective office on a state board or commission, and the office of a member of the state House of Representatives or Senate. The costs associated with holding a closed party primary election are already contemplated in the existing projected election expenses. Proposed law would move these candidates from the scheduled fall primary to the scheduled spring closed party primary and does not create any new statewide elections.
