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Provides relative to colorectal screening

Present law mandates coverage of routine colorectal cancer screening done by specific testing which was recommended by the American College of Gastroenterology in consultation with the American Cancer Society. Proposed law removes references to specific tests and adds that any test or screening recommended by the National Comprehensive Cancer Network shall be considered covered tests.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. The proposed law removes references to specific tests. Also, the proposed law adds any test or screening recommended by the National Comprehensive Cancer Network shall be considered covered tests. It does not appear that the proposed law will result in any expansion of testing but only increases the number of organizations that can recommend a specific type of test. The Office of Group Benefits (OGB) reports no impact. The health actuary for the LA Department of Insurance (LDI) estimates that there will be no material costs to the private insurance industry as a result of this measure.
