

1 including but not limited to comparisons with other states' rules and regulations; the
2 authority of the governor in other states to review and eliminate rules and regulations; the
3 involvement of the public with regard to the adoption, amendment, and repeal of rules and
4 regulations and ways to improve public participation in the process; the exercise of
5 legislative oversight in other states; and mechanisms to quantify the costs of proposed rules
6 and regulations.

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the special joint legislative committee shall be
8 named the "Special Legislative Committee on Regulatory Reform" and shall be composed
9 of the following:

10 (1) Four members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the
11 House of Representatives, one of whom shall be designated by the speaker as the chairman
12 of the committee.

13 (2) Three members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, one of
14 whom shall be designated by the president as the vice chairman of the committee.

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Speaker of the House of Representatives and
16 the President of the Senate shall designate staff to assist the committee in its work.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Legislative Committee on
18 Regulatory Reform shall report its findings to the legislature prior to December 31, 2024.
