SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 72

SPECIAL DAY/WEEK/MONTH. Designates Wednesday, May 1, 2024, as Literacy Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To designate Wednesday, May 1, 2024, as Literacy Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.
3	WHEREAS, seventy-two percent of Louisiana's fourth grade students do not read
4	proficiently; and
5	WHEREAS, students who do not read proficiently by the end of the third grade are
6	four times more likely to drop out of school, and those who have not mastered at least a
7	basic level of reading proficiency are nearly six times as likely to leave school without
8	earning a diploma; and
9	WHEREAS, dyslexia is a specific learning disability that affects as many as one in
10	five people; and
11	WHEREAS, literacy is foundational to a student's academic success; and
12	WHEREAS, the Center for Literacy and Learning was founded in 1992 and has been
13	implementing instructional and coaching practices based on scientific research, knowledge,
14	and best practices that improve teaching and increase student learning for thirty-two years;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, the Center for Literacy and Learning uses its three hundred forty-seven
17	years of combined professional education experience to focus on closing the achievement
18	gap by increasing teacher effectiveness and advancing public education reform by providing

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- educators who teach our most at-risk children with professional learning that is specific and
   targeted to the needs of those students and their fellow teachers; and
- 3 WHEREAS, with a literacy wraparound approach, the Center for Literacy and 4 Learning provides services to educators, families, and communities to support both in and 5 out-of-classroom learning; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the Center for Literacy and Learning and the Louisiana Department of 7 Education created a key partnership emphasizing the importance of improving our state's 8 literacy rates and launched the Literacy Coaching Program in 2020, through which 9 specialists served twelve local education agencies, fifty-three individual schools, and forty-10 five literacy coaches in the 2023-2024 school year; and
- WHEREAS, in 2019, the Center for Literacy and Learning successfully advocated
  for the legislative creation of the Early Literacy Commission, which met as a body of experts
  to review and discuss the progress of literacy initiatives of the Louisiana Department of
  Education; and
- WHEREAS, in 2023, the Center for Literacy and Learning successfully advocated for the legislative creation of the Louisiana Literacy Advisory Commission, which meets to discuss and make recommendations for improving, strengthening, and supporting literacy in Louisiana; and
- WHEREAS, improving the literacy rate in Louisiana is necessary for developing a
  robust workforce, creating high-quality jobs, and strengthening our economy.
- THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby commend the dedicated work of the Center for Literacy and Learning, extend sincere gratitude for their work in improving reading proficiency in all of Louisiana's students, and designate Wednesday, May 1, 2024, as Literacy Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.
