# **CRIMINAL/RECORDS:** Provides relative to expungement of criminal records.

# DIGEST

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the court may order the immediate expungement of the arrest and conviction of the violation that necessitated participation in the probation or program for a person who is otherwise eligible for an expungement upon the successful completion of a court-ordered probation or alternative sentencing program.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that only the form provided in <u>present law</u> is to be used to expunge the record of a person who is otherwise eligible for an expungement upon the successful completion of a court-ordered probation or alternative sentencing program.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the immediate expungement will be served pursuant to the provisions of <u>present law</u> and must include the court record with the signed order with all of the following:

- (1) The bill of information.
- (2) The sentencing minutes.
- (3) Any documents or records relevant to the arrest incident and plea agreements, if available.

(Adds C.Cr.P. Art. 985.3)

#### Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

- The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Administration of</u> <u>Criminal Justice to the original bill:</u>
- 1. Clarify that the expungement is "immediate" <u>rather than</u> "automatic".

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Make technical changes.
- 2. Specify that a court may order the immediate expungement of the arrest and conviction of the violation that necessitated participation in the probation or program.
- 3. Provide the expungement form to be used.
- 4. Provide for service of the immediate expungement pursuant to present law (C.Cr.P. Art. 982) and specify what information is to be included within the signed order.
- 5. Exempt a person who is eligible for an immediate expungement from the expungement fees provided in <u>present law</u>.
