Creates an additional judgeship for the 21st Judicial District Court

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Current law provides that the 21st Judicial District Court shall have nine judges. Proposed law provides that the 21st Judicial District consists of two election sections, one and two, and provides the composition of both election sections; provides that nine judges shall be elected from election section one and that the additional judge shall be elected from election section two and shall have jurisdiction throughout the district; provides that the individual to be elected to the additional judgeship shall be elected by Article V, Section 22 of the Constitution to a term beginning the first January following the effective date for elections for judgeships in the 21st Judicial District Court (six-year term at the congressional election held in 2014 and eery sixth year thereafter); provides that all successors to the judgeship created by the proposed law shall be elected at the same time and serve the same term as provided by law for other judges of the court; provides that the additional judgeship shall become effective if and when a work point study by the National Center for State Courts is completed in accordance with HCR 39 of the 2024 RS and the work point study concludes the additional district court judgeship is necessary.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an increase of \$231,442 (\$221,442 in annual expenses and \$10,000 in one-time expenses) in FY FY 26 and will be annualized in future fiscal years (approximately \$442,884 annually). These expenses are associated with adding one judge within the 21st Judicial District Court, Section Two (Tangipahoa and St. Helena). The new judgeship becomes effective contingent on if and when a work point study by the National Center for State Courts is completed in accordance with HCR 39 of the 2024 RS and concludes that an additional district court judgeship is necessary. Also, HCR 39 requires submission of the work point study by the Judicial Structure Task Force by 2/01/25. The LFO presumes that, if the work point study concludes that an additional district court judgeship is necessary in the 21st Judicial District Court, the creation of the judgeship contemplated by the proposed law will begin on 1/01/26.


Note: The expenses will be funded with 57% SGF, 4% Statutory Dedications (Judges Supplemental Compensation Fund), and 39% Local Funds.

The <u>proposed law</u> will result in an increase of \$7,700 in Local Funds expenditures to local governing authorities associated with adding an item onto a ballot for an election for the 21st Judicial District Court. During a gubernatorial, Congressional, presidential, or special election that includes candidacy for state offices on a given ballot, local governing authorities are responsible for 10% of the costs associated with balloting. The Secretary of State advises that the \$7,700 is an estimate, and that actual costs cannot be determined until the election is held and all costs are known.
