All civil actions brought against a nonqualified healthcare provider shall be 18 subject to civil liability based upon the applicable standard of care.

Strict liability or liability of any kind including actions relating to 20 succession rights and inheritance shall not be applicable to any No physician, healthcare provider, hospital, in vitro fertilization clinic, laboratory personnel, 21 22 provider of products and services, or their agent who acts in good faith participates 23 in the screening, collection, conservation, preparation, fertilization, culture, transfer, 24 biopsy, thawing, warming, analysis, storage, transportation, or cryopreservation, or 25 any acts typically performed during the in vitro fertilization process of the human ovum embryo fertilized in vitro for transfer to the human uterus shall be subject to 26 27 criminal prosecution except in cases where acts were made with criminal intent as 28 defined by R.S. 14:10. Any immunity granted by this Section is applicable only to 29 an action brought on behalf of the in vitro fertilized human ovum as a juridical 30 person."
