HB 71 2024 Regular Session Horton

SCHOOLS: Requires the display of the Ten Commandments in schools

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

- 1. Removes requirement for the display of the Ten Commandments in nonpublic schools and nonpublic postsecondary education institutions.
- 2. Removes requirement for the display of the Ten Commandments in buildings that are not schools that public school governing authorities use.
- 3. Requires a context statement to be displayed with the displays of the Ten Commandments in public schools.
- 4. Authorizes public schools to display the Mayflower Compact, the Declaration of Independence, and the Northwest Ordinance.
- 5. Removes authorization to use public funds to purchase displays.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Proposed law</u> requires each public school governing authority to display the Ten Commandments in each classroom in each school under its jurisdiction.

<u>Proposed law</u> applies to charter schools and public postsecondary education institutions. Further requires the display of a context statement with the display of the Ten Commandments in K-12 public schools.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the display of the Mayflower Compact, the Declaration of Independence, and the Northwest Ordinance in K-12 public schools.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires governing authorities, management boards, and institutions to either accept donated displays or to spend donated funds to purchase displays.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that the Ten Commandments:

- (1) Be displayed on a poster or framed document that is at least 11 inches by 14 inches.
- (2) Be the central focus of the poster or framed document.
- (3) Be printed in a large, easily readable font.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
