<u>Proposed law</u> requires a hospital that treats a minor that is suspected of an opioid overdose to conduct a urine drug screen on the minor that shall include testing for the presence of fentanyl.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the hospital to report any screening conducted in accordance with <u>proposed law</u> that detects fentanyl to the La. Dept. of Health. <u>Proposed law</u> further provides that the hospital shall de-identify the report prior to submission.
