COMMITTEE STUDIES. Requests study of the feasibility of establishing state subsidized parental leave for K-12 educators.

1	A STUDY REQUEST
2	To request the Senate Committees on Education and Finance to study the feasibility of
3	establishing state subsidized parental leave for K-12 educators.
4	WHEREAS, it is a well recognized fact that paid parental leave has positive health
5	and economic benefits for educators and their families; and
6	WHEREAS, educators are the backbone of our society and teachers in many states,
7	including Louisiana, have no guarantee of paid parental leave; and
8	WHEREAS, research shows that paid parental leave improves infant mortality rates,
9	breastfeeding initiations and duration, and maternal mental health; and
10	WHEREAS, paid parental leave also supports adoptive parents by providing time to
11	resolve logistical issues and bond with their new child while easing the financial burden that
12	often comes with adoption; and
13	WHEREAS, studies have shown that fathers who take paternity leave experience
14	greater engagement in their child's life, which in turn has cognitive and developmental
15	advantages for children; and
16	WHEREAS, research shows that paid family leave helps increase employee retention
17	and decrease turnover, thereby reducing the state's cost for hiring and training; and
18	WHEREAS, without dedicated paid parental leave, educators often have no choice

1	but to use sick or vacation days when a new child arrives, which reduces their earned pai		
2	leave for times when other family issues occur, such as doctor wellness appointments or		
3	child sickness; and		
4	WHEREAS, several states have enacted paid parental leave policies for their		
5	educators including Tennessee, Georgia, South Carolina, and North Carolina and hav		
6	discovered that such policies have resulted in twenty percent fewer women leaving their job		
7	in the first year after welcoming a child, and fifty percent fewer women leaving after fiv		
8	years; and		
9	WHEREAS, in Louisiana, any proposed legislation to enact a similar program will		
10	result in an increase in state government expenditures and an impact on local expenditures		
11	and		
12	WHEREAS, the state fiscal impact is due to the requirement that the Louisiana		
13	Department of Education reimburse local education agencies for payments made to		
14	substitute employees while a permanent employee is on paid leave; and		
15	WHEREAS, paid parental leave would provide many teachers and support staff the		
16	security that they will have a paycheck while they take the necessary personal time to		
17	recover from childbirth or care for their new child.		
18	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana		
19	requests that the Senate Committees on Education and Finance meet and function as a joint		
20	committee to study the feasibility of establishing state subsidized parental leave for K-1		
21	educators.		
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Study Request shall be transmitted		
23	to the superintendent of the state Department of Education.
