HB 728 2024 Regular Session Davis

HIGHER EDUCATION: Lowers minimum age for eligibility for the M.J. Foster Promise Program from 21 to 17 and phases in this age change over a period of four award years

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

- 1. Reinstate <u>present law</u> provision requiring an award recipient to have no conviction for any crime of violence.
- 2. Phase in the lowering of the age from 21 to 17 over four award years.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law provides</u> for the M.J. Foster Promise Program, a financial assistance program for students attending a two-year public postsecondary education institution or proprietary school who are enrolled in certain qualified programs. Provides for specific initial eligibility requirements, including being at least 21 years old. <u>Proposed law</u> lowers the minimum age from 21 to 17 and phases in this age change by providing that a student be at least:

- (1) Age 20 in the 2024-2025 award year.
- (2) Age 19 in the 2025-2026 award year.
- (3) Age 18 in the 2026-2027 award year.
- (4) Age 17 in the 2027-2028 award year and thereafter.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
