PUBLIC RECORDS: Provides a limited exception for the schedule of a statewide elected official

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

1. Remove a provision authorizing records of a meeting or event that a statewide official attends and transportation thereto to remain confidential for up to seven days after the occurrence of the meeting or event.
2. Provide that nothing in proposed law shall alter any legal deadlines contained in the Public Records Law.
3. Make technical changes.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

Proposed law provides that any record of the office of lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, treasurer, commissioner of agriculture, or commissioner of insurance pertaining to the schedule of the official or of an employee of the office that contains security details that if made public may impair the safety of the official may be held confidential for a period of seven days following a scheduled event.

Proposed law does not make confidential all records concerning a meeting or event that the official attends and transportation related thereto or alter any legal deadlines provided by present law (Public Records Law).
