SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 152

BY SENATORS BOUIE, BARROW, BOUDREAUX, DUPLESSIS, FIELDS, HARRIS, JACKSON-ANDREWS, LUNEAU, PRICE, JENKINS AND CARTER

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT. To urge and request the Louisiana Department of Education and the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to prohibit the use of "edutainment" children videos that are discriminatory and anti-Semitic as educational tools in classrooms.

A RESOLUTION

5	WHEREAS, on Tuesday, May 28, 2024, at a statewide teacher conference, the state
6	Superintendent of Education, Cade Brumley, announced his endorsement that teachers can
7	show student videos by PragerU, a right-wing media nonprofit that produces "pro-America"
8	content; and
9	WHEREAS, in his announcement, the superintendent said that "PragerU's videos
10	align with the state's new social studies standards ", which he calls the "Freedom
11	Framework"; and
12	WHEREAS, the superintendent also stated that "Louisiana was the first state to adopt
13	new, rigorous social studies standards that teach students about American exceptionalism
14	and our quest for a more perfect union", according to a statement released by PragerU. "This
15	partnership will provide teachers with additional resources to help bring our 'Freedom
16	Framework' to life"; and
17	WHEREAS, PragerU said its partnership with Louisiana is "more expansive" than
18	in other states, adding that Louisiana's education department approved an "extensive list" of

WHEREAS, educators, legislators, historians, and political scientists have criticized PragerU's video for content promoting conservative viewpoints on various political, economic, and sociological topics containing misleading or inaccurate claims about slavery and racism in the United States, immigration, and the history of fascism; and

WHEREAS, PragerU has published videos critical of other faiths, including "Where Are the Moderate Muslims?" and "Born to Hate Jews"; and

WHEREAS, content on the PragerU Kids YouTube channel, which has received backlash, includes a video depicting a cartoon Christopher Columbus saying slavery wasn't an issue during his time period because of its widespread use and another describing George Floyd as a "Black man who resisted arrest"; and

WHEREAS, PragerU's videos for students in grades kindergarten through twelve promotes a conservative world view; for example, a book called "Sofia Survives the Border" for middle and high schoolers teaches students "why strong borders are essential for keeping communities safe and prosperous"; and

WHEREAS, a video for grades six through twelve called "Los Angeles: Mateo Backs the Blue" explores "how the Black Lives Matter (BLM) movement and anti-police sentiment affected crime, families, and small businesses in American cities"; and

WHEREAS, when PragerU received blowback from educators and historians after being granted approval to show videos to students in kindergarten through sixth grade in public schools in Florida, PragerU said that its content pushes back against what it calls "woke agendas infiltrating classrooms"; and

WHEREAS, in its 2023 annual report, PragerU stated that it is dedicated to "Biblical values, protecting children's innocence, celebrating America's exceptional history, civic responsibility, rejecting woke culture, and defending free speech"; and

WHEREAS, the unique things to understand about PragerU is that there is no bid process for the videos, it is not a traditional vendor that requires payment, it is not an accredited university, it does not have creators with a vast education background, and its website states what its intention is, which is purely for indoctrination, and says it is specifically for conservative values; and

WHEREAS, the Preamble to Art. VIII of the Constitution of Louisiana states: "[t]he goal of the public educational system is to provide learning environments and experiences, at all stages of human development, that are humane, just, and designed to promote excellence in order that every individual may be afforded an equal opportunity to develop to his full potential".

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Louisiana Department of Education and the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to prohibit use of "edu-tainment" children videos that are discriminatory and anti-Semitic as educational tools in classrooms.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the state superintendent of education and the president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.
