 Provides relative to the adoption of national standards for criminal adjudications

Proposed law provides that beginning January 1, 2025, the clerk of court for each judicial district shall provide a daily electronic submission to the Louisiana Supreme Court containing the date of an offense, date of arrests or summons (if a summons was issued in lieu of an arrest), the state identification number of the defendant (if one has been assigned to the defendant for the offense or any prior offenses), defendant demographic data (to include sex, race, and date of birth), for prosecutions of an offense involving violations of any state law or local ordinance, the date of initiation of prosecution, data of adjudication, and number of days from initiation of prosecution to adjudication for all criminal cases; requires data required for reporting in the proposed law to be recorded and reported to the Louisiana Supreme Court in a standard format and practice as directed by the court.

The proposed law may result in an increased workload in the clerks of court for each judicial district, as the clerks of court will be required to submit additional information in its daily report to the Louisiana Supreme Court containing the date of an offense, date of arrests, or summons (if a summons was issued in lieu of an arrest), the state identification number of the defendant (if one has been assigned to the defendant for the offense or any prior offenses), defendant demographic data (to include sex, race and date of birth), for prosecutions of an offense involving violations of any state law or local ordinance, the date of initiation of prosecution, date of adjudication, and number of days from initiation of prosecution to adjudication for all criminal cases. To the extent the proposed law results in an increased workload in the clerks of court, the LFO presumes that the clerks of court can absorb this anticipated workload using existing staff and resources.
