HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 352

BY REPRESENTATIVES WRIGHT, BERAULT, AND GLORIOSO

HIGHWAYS/INTERSTATE: Urges and requests the Department of Transportation and Development to study the benefits of opening the U.S. 90 West Pearl River Bridge, provide an estimate of the amount of maritime traffic traveling through the West Pearl River Bridge, and compare the advantages and disadvantages of a fixed versus movable bridge to deter potential barriers

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Department of Transportation and Development to study the
3	benefits of opening the U.S. 90 West Pearl River Bridge, provide a estimate of the
4	amount of maritime traffic traveling through the West Pearl River Bridge, and
5	compare the advantages and disadvantages of a fixed versus movable bridge to deter
6	potential barriers.
7	WHEREAS, the West Pearl River Bridge possesses significance as one of four
8	bridges constructed to carry US-90 and Old Spanish Trail over the Pearl River in St.
9	Tammany Parish in the early 1930s; and
10	WHEREAS, the bridge is an essential part of the Rigolets to Pearlington highway
11	shortcut connecting New Orleans to the Mississippi Gulf Coast; and
12	WHEREAS, the West Pearl River bridge at the Louisiana-Mississippi state line has
13	been closed for over a year; and
14	WHEREAS, closure of the bridge has removed the east-west corridor as an
15	alternative and now traffic is clogged on I-10; and
16	WHEREAS, the closure of the West Pearl Bridge has placed a strain on businesses
17	and daily commuters that depend on the route as an alternative due to traffic congestion on
18	I-10; and

1	WHEREAS, the expected 2028 completion date for the West Pearl River bridge is
2	a disservice to citizens especially during hurricane seasons; and
3	WHEREAS, having access to the West Pearl River Bridge and I-10 during hurricane
4	season reduced the risk of being trapped if one route was inaccessible and helped with traffic
5	congestion allowing for timely arrivals to safe destinations; and
6	WHEREAS, access to the West Pearl River Bridge allows for first responders to have
7	quicker access to help citizens rather than taking a longer route which could likely result in
8	a negative impact on the health outcomes of the residents; and
9	WHEREAS, not only has the closure of the bridge caused an impact on motorists but
10	also has placed barriers on maritime traffic, as well as our state's economy; and
11	WHEREAS, the maritime industry in Louisiana has a sizeable economic impact on
12	the state and nation; and
13	WHEREAS, the height restriction on the West Pearl River Bridge has limited
14	maritime traffic; and
15	WHEREAS, it is in the state's best interest to continuously track the amount of
16	maritime traffic coming through West Pearl Bridge to determine the operational efficiency;
17	and
18	WHEREAS, knowing that safety is the main priority and ensuring the bridge is
19	suitable for travel, an additional four years to repair the bridge will do more harm especially
20	during peak hurricane seasons as potential evacuees will no longer be able to rely on the
21	bridge as an evacuation route; and
22	WHEREAS, another option may be determining whether a fixed or movable bridge
23	is more advantageous to the needs of the local residents and the maritime industry alike; and
24	WHEREAS, deciding between a fixed and movable bridge is not easy, as it depends
25	on variety of factors such as its width, depth, flow, and tidal range; the characteristics of the
26	bridge, such as its length, width, height, load, and design; the characteristics of the traffic,
27	such as its volume, speed, direction, and mode; and
28	WHEREAS, ultimately the goal is to expedite the reopening of the West Pearl River
29	Bridge by possibly reconstructing it to a fixed or movable bridge so the residents that are

- 1 accustom to traversing the bridge can return to some semblance of normalcy and barriers to
- 2 maritime traffic can be removed to return the river to commerce.
- 3 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
 4 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Department of Transportation and
 5 Development to study the benefits of opening the U.S. 90 West Pearl River Bridge, provide
 6 a estimate of the amount of maritime traffic traveling through the West Pear River Bridge,
 7 and compare the advantages and disadvantages of a fixed versus movable bridge.
 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation and
- 9 Development shall submit a report detailing its findings to the House Committee on
- 10 Transportation, Highways and Public Works by January 1, 2025.
- 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
- 12 secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development.
