Existing law allows certain businesses and organizations that provide care to children, elderly, or individuals with disabilities to register with the La. Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information to obtain a state and federal criminal history report on individuals who have or seek to have access to those children, elderly, or individuals with disabilities, to determine their suitability to be providing care to those persons.

Prior law defined an "individual" as a person who has, seeks to have, or may have access to children, the elderly, or individuals with disabilities, served by a qualified entity as (1) a person employed by or volunteers with, or seeks to be employed by or volunteer with, a qualified entity or (2) a person who owns or operates, or seeks to own or operate, a qualified entity.

New law retains prior law and adds a person who contracts with, or seeks to contract with, a qualified entity to the definition of "individual".

Effective August 1, 2024.
