ACT 132 (HB 283)

New law requires that by Jan. 1, 2025, any trade school, community college, agency, public or private school, or person offering instruction in the operation of a commercial motor vehicle as part of a commercial motor vehicle driving course curriculum to include industry specific anti-trafficking training on the recognition, prevention, and reporting of human trafficking.

New law requires that beginning Aug. 1, 2024, the Bd. of Regents must establish industry specific anti-trafficking training materials for use in instruction on the recognition, prevention, and effective reporting of human trafficking by applicants as a requirement to obtain a Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license. New law authorizes the board to collaborate with organizations that specialize in and offer training materials on the recognition, prevention, and reporting of human trafficking for commercial truckers.

New law requires the board to review and update the training materials every three years to account for changes and trends in human trafficking.

Effective August 1, 2024.
