ACT 3 (SB 9) 2024 Second Extraordinary Session Mizell

<u>Prior law</u> allowed the prosecution of any sex crime to be initiated outside of the existing time limitations when the identity of a suspect is established by DNA testing.

<u>New law</u> allows the prosecution of any sex crime to be initiated outside of the current time limitations when the identity of a suspect is established using newly discovered photographic or video evidence and otherwise retains <u>prior law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a prosecution for a sex crime initiated outside of the existing time limitation must commence within three years of when the identity of the suspect is established by DNA testing.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but adds that a prosecution for a sex crime initiated outside of the existing time limitation must commence within three years of when the identity of the suspect is established using newly discovered photographic or video evidence.
