Hospital Update

Walkway Update- We are still projected to have this project complete by April 26th. The weather did cause some delays but the framing should begin this week. Update on Surgery and ER flood- We had a downpour of water in the Surgery Department and ER on Monday, January 29th following the snowstorm. This downpour was caused by the units on the roof not clearing properly and the coils froze and bursted open (per ACA). This caused significant flooding in the ER and Surgery. The new drywall and insulation will get the units fixed. We will continue to monitor the new drywall and insulation to make sure it stays dry. The units will be re-installed in the next few days. We will schedule a meeting with all parties once installation is completed to get answers as well as what to do prevent this from happening again.
