1 (5) When committed by a person who is in, or who has escaped from, the 2 lawful custody of a law enforcement officer or a place of lawful confinement, even 3 though he has no intent to kill or inflict great bodily harm. 4 5 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 6 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 7 8 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 9 effective on the day following such approval.

**Abstract:** Provides relative to second degree murder.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 14:30.1) provides for the crime of second degree murder.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 14:30.1(A)(2)) provides for a list of offenses that constitute second degree murder even when the offender has no intent to kill or to inflict great bodily harm.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds resisting a police officer with force or violence to this list.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that an additional circumstance of second degree murder is the killing of a human when committed by a person who is in, or who has escaped from, the lawful custody of a law enforcement officer or a place of lawful confinement, even though he has no intent to kill or inflict great bodily harm.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
