ELDERLY: Provides relative to disclosure of financial records available to the governor's office of elderly affairs

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 15:1507(H)(1) and to enact R.S. 6:333(F)(19), relative to access
3	to documents by the office of elderly affairs; to clarify the authority granted to the
4	office; to clarify that banks and their affiliates are authorized to disclose financial
5	records to the office that are needed to perform its duties; and to provide for related
6	matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 6:333(F)(19) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§333. Disclosure of financial records; reimbursement of costs

1	F. The following disclosures by a bank or any affiliate are hereby
12	specifically authorized and, except as otherwise provided in this Subsection, nothing
13	in this Section shall prohibit, restrict, or otherwise apply to:

15	(19) The disclosure by a bank or any of its subsidiaries or affiliates of
16	financial records pursuant to a written request from the office of elderly affairs
17	within the office of the governor certifying that receipt of the records is necessary
18	to the performance of the office's duties under the Adult Protective Services Act.

20	Section 2. R.S. 15:1507(H)(1) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

1 §1507. Investigation of reports, assessment, actions taken, and court orders 2 3 H.(1) The Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the adult 4 protection agency shall have access to any records or documents, including clientidentifying information and medical, psychological, criminal or financial records 5 6 necessary to the performance of the agency's duties under this Chapter. The duties 7 include the provision of protective services to an adult, or the investigation of abuse, 8 neglect, exploitation or extortion of an adult. A person or agency that has a record 9 or document that the adult protection agency needs to perform its duties under this 10 Chapter shall, without unnecessary delay, make the record or document available to 11 the agency. 12

Abstract: Authorizes banks to disclose financial records pursuant to a request from the office of elderly affairs within the office of the governor.

Present law authorizes certain disclosures by banks or their affiliates.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds financial records requested by the office of elderly affairs within the office of the governor to the list of authorized disclosures.
