POLICE/MUNICIPAL: Provides for the abolition of the office of police chief and police department in the village of Hall Summit

2	To enact R.S. 33:381(C)(37), relative to the village of Hall Summit and Red River Parish;		
3	to provide for the abolition of the office of police chief and the police department in		
4	the village of Hall Summit; to authorize the town to contract with other law		
5	enforcement entities in the parish for law enforcement services; and to provide for		
6	related matters.

10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:		
11	Section 1. R.S. $33:381(C)(37)$ is hereby enacted to read as follows:

16	(37)(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the board		
17	of aldermen of the village of Hall Summit may, upon recommendation of the mayor,		
18	abolish the office of chief of police of the village. No such action by the board shall		
19	be effective until the end of the term of the police chief in office at the time of that		
20	action or when a vacancy occurs in the office, whichever occurs first; however, if at

1	the time of that action the office is filled by an officer temporarily appointed, the
2	abolition of the office shall become effective as provided by ordinance.
3	(b) If the office of chief of police is abolished and the municipal police
4	department is abolished pursuant to R.S. 33:362(C), the mayor and board of
5	aldermen may contract with or enter into a cooperative endeavor agreement with any
6	law enforcement entity or officer within Red River Parish for police services for the
7	village.

Abstract: Provides for the abolition of the office of police chief and police department in the village of Hall Summit and authorizes the municipality to contract for law enforcement services.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the officers of every municipality governed by the provisions of the Lawrason Act (mayor-board of aldermen form of government) shall be a mayor, aldermen, a chief of police, a tax collector, and a clerk.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 33:362(C)) provides that any department of such a municipality, other than the police department in a municipality with an elected chief of police, shall be created, abolished, merged, or consolidated by the board of aldermen, upon the written recommendation of the mayor.

<u>Present law</u> provides for at-large election of the mayor and police chief in all municipalities. Further provides for exceptions with respect to the chief of police in certain municipalities.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides an exception for the office of police chief in the village of Hall Summit. Provides that the board of aldermen may, upon the recommendation of the mayor, abolish the office of police chief. Provides that the office cannot be abolished until the end of the term of the police chief in office at the time of that action or when a vacancy occurs in the office, whichever occurs first; however, if at the time of that action the office is filled by an officer temporarily appointed, the abolition of the office will become effective as provided by ordinance.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if the office of police chief and the police department are abolished pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> and <u>present law</u>, the mayor and board of aldermen may contract with any other law enforcement entity or officer within Red River Parish for police services.
