LOCAL GOVERNMENT: Authorizes the town of Golden Meadow in Lafourche Parish to designate certain alternative pathways along state highways for golf carts and low-speed vehicles

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 32:297.1, relative to the designation of alternative pathways for certain
3	vehicles in the town of Golden Meadow; to authorize the use of golf carts and low-
4	speed vehicles only on the shoulders of public roads and streets; to provide for
5	definitions; to establish speed limits; to enforce regulations for operators; to provide
6	for the registration of golf carts and low-speed vehicles; to authorize a governing
7	authority to assess a registration fee; and to provide for related matters.
8	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published as provided by
9	Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of Louisiana.
0	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
1	Section 1. R.S. 32:297.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
12	§297.1. Alternative pathways for golf carts and low-speed vehicles
13	A. As used in this Section, the following terms shall have the following
4	meanings:
15	(1) "Town" means the town of Golden Meadow, Louisiana.
16	(2) "Governing authority" means the town council of the town of Golden
17	Meadow, Louisiana.

1	(2) "Golf cart" means an electric four-wheeled vehicle originally intended
2	for use off-road on golf courses and other green spaces whose maximum speed is
3	twenty-five miles per hour.
4	(3) "Low-speed vehicle" means any four-wheeled electric or gasoline
5	powered vehicle that has a top speed greater than twenty miles per hour but less than
6	twenty five miles per hour and is equipped with headlamps, front and rear turn signal
7	lamps, tail lamps, stop lamps, reflex reflectors, including one on each side as far to
8	the rear as practicable, and one red reflector on the rear of the vehicle, an exterior
9	mirror mounted on the passenger's side of the vehicle or an interior mirror, a parking
10	brake, a windshield that conforms to the American National Standard Institute's
11	"Safety Code for Safety Glazing Material for Glazing Motor Vehicles Operating on
12	Land Highways - Safety Standard", a windshield wiper, speedometer, odometer,
13	braking for each wheel, a seat belt assembly installed at each designated seating
14	position, and a vehicle identification number.
15	B.(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the
16	governing authority may, in its discretion, by ordinance authorize the operation of
17	golf carts and low-speed vehicles only on the shoulder of a public road and street
18	having a speed limit of thirty miles or less per hour. The authorization shall be
19	contained in an ordinance and recorded in the minutes of the governing authority.
20	The authorization may be accompanied by conditions not inconsistent with this
21	Section and may be revoked, in whole, or in part, by the governing authority at any
22	time.
23	(2) Any person operating a golf cart or low-speed vehicle on the shoulder of
24	a public road or street in the town pursuant to this Section shall be properly licensed
25	to operate a vehicle upon any highway within this state and shall have in his
26	possession proof of insurance as required by Part I-A of Chapter 5 of Title 32 of the
27	Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950.
28	C.(1) Every golf cart and low-speed vehicle operated pursuant to this Section
29	shall be required to be registered with the governing authority. The owner of the golf

cart or low-speed vehicle shall be issued a registration decal by the governing
authority that must be displayed as determined by the governing authority. The
registration shall remain valid for as long as the registering owner owns the golf cart
or low-speed vehicle.

(2) The governing authority may, by ordinance, establish a registration fee
for golf carts and low-speed vehicles. The registration fee shall be retained by the
municipal clerk and deposited into the municipal general fund.

Abstract: Authorizes the town of Golden Meadow, in Lafourche Parish, to designate certain alternative pathways along Department of Transportation and Development highways.

Proposed law defines "town", "governing authority", "golf cart", and "low-speed vehicle".

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that the governing authority may authorize the operation of golf carts and low-speed vehicles only on the shoulder of a public road and street in the town with a speed limit of 30 mph or less. Additionally, specifies that the authorization must be included in an ordinance and recorded in the minutes of the governing authority.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires any person operating a golf cart or low-speed vehicle on the shoulder of a public road or street to have in his possession a valid driver's license from this state and proof of insurance in accordance with <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires any person operating a golf cart or low-speed vehicle on the shoulder of a public road or street in the town to be properly licensed to operate a vehicle upon any highway within this state and have in his possession proof of insurance as required by <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the owner of a golf cart or low-speed vehicle operated as authorized under <u>proposed law</u> on the shoulder of a street or a public road to register the vehicle with the governing authority. Additionally, requires the owner of the golf cart or low-speed vehicle be issued a registration decal by the governing authority that must be displayed as determined by the governing authority.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the governing authority to establish a registration fee for golf carts and low-speed vehicles by ordinance. Additionally, requires the registration fee be retained by the municipal clerk and deposited into the municipal general fund.
