1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 17:2922.1(B)(1)(j) and (k), relative to the Dual Enrollment Task
3 Force; to provide for the membership of the task force; and to provide for related
4 matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 17:2922.1(B)(1)(j) and (k) are hereby amended and reenacted to read
7 as follows:

8 §2922.1. Dual Enrollment Framework Task Force; creation; purpose; membership;
9 definitions; reporting; termination

11 B.(1) The task force shall be composed of fourteen members as follows:

Abstract: Revises the membership of the Dual Enrollment Task Force.

Present law establishes the Dual Enrollment Task Force to make recommendations for a statewide dual enrollment framework to provide universal access to dual enrollment courses.

Proposed law removes two obsolete members from the task force and adds two members, the chief executive officers of Leaders for a Better La. and the Pelican Institute for Public Policy.

1. Remove the task force member representing Education Trust in Louisiana and add the chief executive officer of the Pelican Institute for Public Policy.
