AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:134(A)(2) and the introductory paragraph of R.S. 32:47(A)
3	and to enact R.S. 32:47(C), relative to malfeasance in office; to provide for the
4	provisions for malfeasance in office regarding issuance of traffic camera citations;
5	to provide relative to traffic camera recording devices; to provide for penalties for
6	malfeasance in office; to provide for clarifying the penalties associated with the use
7	of automated speed enforcement devices used in certain manners; and to provide for
8	related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 14:134(A)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
11	§134. Malfeasance in office
12	A. Malfeasance in office is committed when any public officer or public
13	employee shall:

15	(2) Intentionally perform any such duty in an unlawful manner, including

1	Section 2. The introductory paragraph of R.S. 32:47(A) is hereby amended and
2	reenacted and R.S. 32:47(C) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
3	§47. Use of handheld speed recording devices; restrictions
4	A. Automated speed enforcement devices or mobile speed cameras pursuant
5	to R.S. 32:43 and 45 that are handheld or manned, and used to issue a citation of an
6	alleged violation by mail, shall only be used by local municipal authorities or local
7	parish authorities in the following instances:
8	* * *
9	C. In addition to any other remedy provided by law, the use of handheld,
10	manned, or unmanned automated speed enforcement devices or mobile speed
11	cameras that can be mounted in a vehicle or deployed at various locations to
12	monitor and record the speed of passing traffic for the purpose of issuing a
13	citation of an alleged violation by mail intentionally inconsistent with R.S. 32:43
14	et seq., shall be punishable as provided for in R.S. 14:134.

Present law provides malfeasance in office is committed when any public officer or public employee intentionally performs any duty in an unlawful manner.

Proposed law retains present law and clarifies violating the prohibitions of handheld, manned and unmanned traffic cameras or speed limit enforcement devices used for the purpose of issuing citations by mail is malfeasance in office.

Proposed law removes automated speed enforcement devices that are handheld or manned from present law restrictions. Proposed law otherwise retains present law.

Effective August 1, 2025.
