(i) If the initial examination, pursuant to Paragraph (B)(1) of this Section, has been made in person by a psychiatrist, psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner, or a psychologist.

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Abstract: Removes the requirement that an initial examination, conducted prior to issuing an emergency certificate, be executed by a psychiatrist, a psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner, or a psychologist in St. Tammany Parish.

<u>Present law</u> requires a psychiatrist, a psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner, or a psychologist to conduct an in-person examination of an individual prior to issuing an emergency certificate.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes <u>present law</u> by removing the requirement that the in-person examination be conducted by a psychiatrist, psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner, or a psychologist.
