Provides for the the procurement of voting systems

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Current law provides for the procurement of voting systems by a competitive request for proposal process or public bids; and provides for the Voting System Proposal Evaluation Committee and its role in the procurement process. Proposed law changes the allowable procurement methods to competitive sealed proposals or the invitation to negotiate; updates language for the evaluation committee based on new allowable procurement methods; provides for the legal and contractual remedies for the procurement of voting systems; proposed law sunsets on June 30, 2027.
