## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

Proposed law may result in cost savings to the state, assumed here to be SGF, beginning in FY 27. Proposed law transfers the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) from the Executive Department to the Military Department.

The LFO assumes the proposed law may result in the elimination of various duplicative support services within GOHSEP. The Military Department reports it is currently reviewing services for redundancy, process efficiencies, and cost reductions. Early analysis by the agencies indicates some redundancy in staffing. To the extent that any positions under GOHSEP and the Military Department are duplicative, this legislation may result in savings from efficiencies and economies of scale in future fiscal years.

GOHSEP and the Military Department report that any such savings will be realized in FY 27 when they merge budget units.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
