Abstract: Requires certain postsecondary education students to complete an anti-hazing course.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:1801.1), relative to hazing policies and education, requires that each new postsecondary student be provided a handbook on the dangers of and prohibition on hazing.

<u>Present law</u> further requires that certain organizations, as a condition of operating at a postsecondary education institution, annually provide hazing prevention education to its current and prospective members. <u>Proposed law</u> increases the minimum amount of time of the education <u>from</u> one hour <u>to</u> two hours.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires an institution to terminate an organization's operation on campus if it fails to comply with the hazing prevention education requirement. Further requires the institution to submit a report to the House and Senate committees on education upon such termination.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:1801) defines "organization" as a fraternity, sorority, association, corporation, order, society, corps, cooperative, club, service group, social group, band, spirit group, athletic team, or similar group whose members are primarily students at, or former students of, a postsecondary education institution in this state. Further includes the national or parent organization of which any of these underlying entities is a sanctioned or recognized member at the time of the hazing. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Education</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

- 1. Remove requirement that a member of an organization as defined by <u>present law</u> (R.S. 17:1801) complete a one-credit hour anti-hazing course within the first two semesters of his membership.
- 2. Increase minimum amount of time that certain organizations are required to provide annual hazing prevention education to its members <u>from</u> one hour <u>to</u> two hours.
- 3. Require an institution to (1) terminate an organization's operation on campus if it fails to comply with the hazing prevention education requirement, and (2) submit a report to

the House and Senate committees on education upon such termination.
