JUDGES EG SEE FISC NOTE GF EX (Constitutional Amendment) Provides relative to the mandatory retirement of judges

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<u>Current law</u> provides that a judge shall not remain in office beyond his 70th birthday, but also provides that he may remain in office until the completion of his term if he attains 70 years of age while serving a term of office. <u>Proposed law</u> removes the present constitutional age limitation and provides that a judge shall not remain in office after reaching his maximum retirement compensation; applies to all judges sworn into the office of judge on or after 1/01/97; provides for the submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held 11/03/26, or at a statewide election authorized by law, whichever occurs first.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

## **Secretary of State**

The Department of State may incur minimal ballot processing costs associated with this measure. As a regular practice, the Department of State typically budgets for up to 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions for the fall statewide elections. To the extent the ballot includes more than 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions, the Department of State may require additional SGF resources for the November 3, 2026, statewide election. Any expenditure impact would be realized in FY 27.

## Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System (LASERS)

<u>Proposed law</u> will not result in any fiscal impact to the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System, as LASERS currently runs reports on a regular basis for members close to reaching 100% of the final average compensation, and notifies agencies and members of the date that the member will reach 100%.

Note: LASERS advises that of the 352 judges sworn into office since 1/01/97, 11 have reached 100% vested, with the average age of the remaining 341 judges to reach 100% of their vested retirement compensation at 74.5 years, with an average time of service at 28 years.

## **REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
