SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 119

BY SENATOR MIZELL

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EDUCATION DEPARTMENT. Requests the Louisiana Department of Education to develop and implement a system for collecting and reporting aggregated, non-identifiable data on suicide risk assessments conducted in public schools.

A RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the Louisiana Department of Education to develop and implement a
3	system for collecting and reporting aggregated, non-identifiable data on suicide risk
4	assessments conducted in public schools and to submit an annual report of the data
5	to the House and Senate committees on health and welfare, and to involve Peer
6	Initiative and the Louisiana Mental Health Association in the development
7	implementation, and training associated with this process.
8	WHEREAS, suicide has tragically become the second leading cause of death for
9	teenagers in Louisiana, with rates steadily increasing nationwide, highlighting an urgent
10	public health crisis; and
11	WHEREAS, the safety, mental health, and well-being of our youth is a priority
12	shared by parents, educators, and communities throughout Louisiana; and
13	WHEREAS, despite the critical nature of this issue, many Louisiana school districts
14	currently lack standardized protocols to collect or report non-identifiable data on suicide risk
15	assessments, leaving policymakers and educators without vital information needed to
16	address and mitigate these risks effectively; and
17	WHEREAS, without a comprehensive, data-driven approach, Louisiana risks falling
18	short in efforts to protect at-risk youth and to implement targeted, impactful mental health

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1	services within our schools; and
2	WHEREAS, data collected through suicide risk assessments would allow the
3	Louisiana Department of Education to identify trends, assess gaps in mental health services,
4	and better allocate resources to address this crisis; and
5	WHEREAS, a statewide initiative to collect and report this critical data would ensure
6	transparency, accountability, and an evidence-based foundation for future suicide prevention
7	efforts; and
8	WHEREAS, Peer Initiative, a statewide leader in peer support and teen suicide
9	prevention, has extensive experience training students and school personnel on mental health
10	and crisis intervention strategies and has demonstrated success in partnering with
11	educational institutions to implement effective prevention programs; and
12	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Mental Health Association (LMHA), a nonprofit
13	organization committed to improving mental health care and advocating for individuals and
14	families affected by mental illness, has a long-standing history of working with schools,
15	communities, and policymakers to promote mental health awareness and support.
16	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
17	does hereby urge and request the Louisiana Department of Education to develop and
18	implement a system for collecting and reporting aggregated, non-identifiable data on suicide
19	risk assessments conducted by school personnel in public schools statewide.
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the data collected shall include but not be
21	limited to:
22	(1) The total number of suicide risk assessments conducted annually.
23	(2) Age ranges and grade levels of students assessed.
24	(3) Aggregated demographic information, including race, ethnicity, and gender.
25	(4) The number of students referred to mental health services as a result of the
26	assessments.
27	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all data collected shall be aggregated and
28	non-identifiable, ensuring that individual students cannot be personally identified.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each school district shall submit an annual report

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completion of each school year.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Louisiana Department of Education shall compile and submit a comprehensive annual report to the House and Senate committees on health and welfare by October first of each year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Louisiana Department of Education shall develop guidelines and provide training resources to assist school districts in the collection and reporting of data and shall include Peer Initiative and the Louisiana Mental Health Association in the development, implementation, and training associated with these efforts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the state superintendent of education and the executive director of the Louisiana School Boards Association.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana recognizes the importance of suicide prevention efforts and expresses its commitment to promoting the mental health and safety of Louisiana's youth through informed, evidence-based policy initiatives.
